

Asterby & Goulceby Parish Council

Meeting held 28 September 2020 —The Chairman noted that this was the second meeting held via Zoom and as there is unlikely to be the option to hold a public meeting for the foreseeable future would encourage members of the public to submit questions or issues they would like raised at the meetings to the Clerk prior to the meeting.

In an overview of the Highways issues logged by the PC it was noted that the Footbridge over the ford in Goulceby has been scheduled for repair in December with road closures in place during this. The PC requested that the depth markers be replaced and LCC have agreed to do this at the same time.(please note this work should have been completed by the time this goes to print). It was noted that the badger hole on Horncastle Road has been repaired too. The return of the flooding on Main Road just past Shoe Lane will be reported on Fix My Street.

It was noted that whilst there have been some technical glitches progress is being made on the new Parish Council website and when complete this will be promoted to residents.

Several residents have recently expressed interest in joining the Parish Council. It was agreed that the current vacancies will be re-advertised on the website and notice board in October and applications will be considered for appointment at the December meeting.

It was noted that the following Planning Applications have been granted full permission:

Extensions and alterations to provide additional living accommodation, raising the roof and erecting a storage building - Goulceby Villa, Watery Lane. Erection of replacement house and outbuildings - Goulceby Lodge, Top Lane.

Councillors were given a brief outline of the Governments recent white papers, Planning for the Future; Changes to the Current Planning System; and Transparency and Competition. It was noted that the key object of the reform is to modernise, speed up the process, make it more data driven and less subjective. Local plans will be required to categorise land as Growth, Renewal or Protected. Growth areas will be suitable for development and automatically given planning permission; Renewal areas will be suitable for 'gentle densification' with a presumption in favour of development; Protected areas will be AONBs, Green Belt land etc and will have development restricted. 
