Priestly Ponderings

Remembrance 2021 & Christmas

How will I ever manage to include Remembrance and Christmas in the same letter, I thought? They seem worlds apart, Remembrance, thoughts about the people we love and lose nationally and more locally and, in our families; Christmas, the joy that we get as we meet with our families and friends to celebrate the birth of Christ and the promise that brought to the world.

Then I thought about wreaths. The unity of this simple adornment for our doors unites both Remembrance and Christmas as our poppy flower ones become holly, baubles and ribbons. It is believed that wreaths began in ancient Greece, olive branches were woven into a ring, to show rank and place. The pre-Christians would make them in the spring to denote surviving the winter. Today, the poppy wreath is the symbol of RBL and the Christmas wreath is symbolic of Christian immortality, as the circle and sphere both represent immortality.

Remember is often used in connection with covenants between God and man. After the flood, God set a "bow in the cloud" as a "token of a covenant" to not again destroy the earth by water and "that I may remember the everlasting covenant between me and every living creature on the earth." (Gen 9:12-13). So now, when we see rainbows, we may think of God and remember He loves us unconditionally. God sent his Son, Jesus Christ, in human form so that we might get to know him better and he know us. Christ's ministry demonstrated that unconditional love for us to copy.

At the last supper, Jesus reminded his disciples that the Passover meal – which already was held in remembrance of the Jews Exodus from Egypt - was to be an opportunity for their memory also. Every-time they ate bread and drank wine they would do it in remembrance of Him (Luke 22:19-20). It is the reason that our communion service has such meaning, when we take communion, we are endlessly renewing that covenant with Jesus that we will remember Him. His gift to the world was dying that we might be forgiven for our sins in this world and renewed in the next.

MEETING HELD 2ND SEPTEMBER 2021

The Council were pleased to receive an application for one of the current vacancies from Jon Mold who lives in Goulceby. His experience includes, Further Education, finance, property, governance, legal, IT and HR. Jon was co-opted onto the Council and we look forward to having him on board.

The Council considered whether to purchase a Noticeboard for Asterby as currently notices are pinned to a tree on the triangle. The purchase was supported in principle and three quotes will be obtained for consideration at the next meeting.

It was noted that no church officiant is available on Remembrance Sunday to hold a service at All Saints, Goulceby. It was agreed that this year money allocated in the Council budget would be used to purchase a poppy wreath from the Royal British Legion. The wreath will be laid at the church just before 11.00 on Sunday 14th November and a 2-minute silence observed. All residents are welcome to attend.

Following an earlier request for a donation from the Air Ambulance the Council discussed whether a grants/donations policy and process would be useful to ensure fairness and transparency if donating money to good causes. It was noted that no requests have been received from local groups to support active hobby clubs or groups in either of the villages so we don't know if there would be value in adopting a scheme. We are seeking the views of residents as to whether there would be support to raise the precept to set aside money in the annual budget for a small grants scheme to support local groups for the benefit of the Parish. Your views on this would be much appreciated and you can contact the Clerk or any of the Councillors via details on the website.

We reviewed progress against the Annual Action Plan 2021-22. The Chalk Stream project had not been organised, but this was mainly due to COVID restrictions; the litter pick had been discussed throughout the year, but not held as it was felt that there has not been a litter issue; the footbridge over the ford has been replaced and new signage installed; the new website has been developed and is being actively used; the PC continues to keep residents informed via the local newsletter; the adequacy of litter bins and dog waste bins continues to be monitored following the installation of the additional bin; it has not been possible to identify any suitable alternative venue for the PC meetings in either village.

Donington on Bain Parish Council

News from the Parish Council

The Parish Council continues to repair the playground and will apply for lottery funding again for a new playground once the COVID situation has passed. We are looking at solutions to clean the moss from the MUGA.

The Parish Council have finally been successful in getting a "Not Suitable for HGV" sign at Welsdale Road. We have been campaigning for some time to get this issue addressed as many Sat Navs take vehicles up this route. Pot holes have also been filled on Welsdale Road.

We discussed the possibility of a leaflet promoting walks around the village. Some funding is available from East Lindsey District Council and there are existing leaflets which could be used or adapted. Discussions regarding this are at an early stage. We are aware of budget constraints. We are also looking into the costs of car park provision for visitors and school drop off but this is at an early stage and we are again aware of budget constraints. The Parish Council is looking at ways to address parking in the village.

Allotments have been very popular last year and we now have a waiting list. All allotment holders have been reminded of the need to keep their allotment in a clean and tidy condition. If anyone is interested in renting an allotment, please contact the clerk.
