The Parish Council would like to thank Ward and Taylor families for donating the tree lights and looking after the tree lights for the last 20 years. The Parish Council would also like to thank the Parker family who have donated a set of lights for the tree this year.

MUGA/PLAYGROUND

FANTASTIC NEWS!!!! The Parish Council have been applying for grant funding from various grant funding sources for a number of years and have finally been successful in their efforts. The Parish council is delighted to announce that a grant of £9,999 has been awarded from the National lottery for the MUGA refurbishment. A SECOND grant towards the remainder of the refurbishment costs has been awarded from UK Grass Routes funding. In total a grant of £17084 has been awarded from UK Grass Routes funding via East Lindsey District Council to cover 50% of the costs of two projects namely the refurbishment of the MUGA and resurfacing of the playground. The remainder of the costs for the resurfacing of the playground will be met from parish council reserves or any remainder from the MUGA project. As previously advised, these projects will not affect the precept. The projects will commence in the Spring. The MUGA and Playground are much appreciated village assets and we look forward to seeing these important village assets refurbished.

Parish Council Meeting

The latest Parish Council meeting was held on Monday 11 th December at All Saints Church, Goulceby. The meeting welcomed the District Councillor and two residents. The minutes of the meeting will be posted on the Parish Council's website and village notice boards in due course.

It was noted that the Horncastle Road is now open with the repair works being concluded in November.

The Goulceby village defibrillator pads have been replaced and a defib' location sign has been purchased which will be placed in the community bus shelter in Goulceby.

The Quickline fast fibre broadband is now fully operational in Goulceby and a number of residents are now benefiting from the increased speeds that fibre brings.

The Parish Council successfully applied for a 100% Community Grant to replace the existing aged wooden noticeboard adjacent to the bus shelter in Goulceby. The new larger noticeboard will be sited within the community bus shelter. Thanks were conveyed to Cllr Daniel Simpson who helped secure this grant.

Flood: The risk of flooding in Lincolnshire is currently increased due to groundwater levels, with boreholes and aquifers being exceptionally high. Such heights are normal in January but very unusual in November/December. The Council has been advised that the flood alleviation scheme in Horncastle does not cover the beck that runs through Goulceby. A discussion took place around the recent flooding in Goulceby and what actions the Parish Council might take. Contact will be made with the relevant agencies to find out what future support and advice might be given to the village.

2024/25 Precept: The Parish Council levies an annual precept on 124 properties in order to raise revenue to fund its administration and other costs. The current precept raises a total of £1,980 per annum at a charge of £15.97 per household. At this level, the precept is 11 th lowest out of 100 Parish Councils in East Lindsey. The average precept in East Lindsey is £46.18 per household with the highest being a charge of £174.56 per household which is for a village with 1,088 households, raising a total of £190,000 for that Parish. The Parish Council operates on minimal costs, the most significant one being the employment of a Clerk/Responsible Finance Officer which is a statutory requirement which helps the Council to undertake its

statutory responsibilities and duties. Whilst the Parish Council does not have any actual facilities to manage, it does have to comply with all relevant Local Government legislation and this requires a certain level of administrative hours.

Following the recruitment of a new Clerk earlier this year, and with new Councillors coming on board, the Council reviewed the workload of the Clerk and found that the number of hours which were being paid represented about 65% of the actual hours required to undertake the minimum administrative work that is required by statute. As a result, the Council has had to increase the number of hours paid to the Clerk in order to make sure that it complies with National Minimum Wage legislation. Additionally, the Council is obliged to use pay rates set by the National Joint Council agreed for Local Government. Due to the recent high rates of inflation the new rates from April 2023 were increased to reflect this. There will also be a further increase from April 2024. The Council has no choice but to apply the national rates which increase the administration costs of the Council. The pay award plus the increase in paid hours to comply with statutory pay levels means that the precept has had to be increased simply to cover basic running costs. Additionally, the high inflation rates have affected other cost areas, for example insurance. A further cost that the Council now has to pay is the annual Audit fee at around £100. This Audit work was previously provided free of charge by an acquaintance of the previous Clerk. The Council does not have significant levels of reserves or other revenue streams and is unable to meet cost increases without raising the level of precept. At the meeting, the Council examined all budget lines in detail and agreed to increase the precept level for 2024/25 to £3,384. This is an increase of £0.94 per month per household.

Of the total precept, 76% funds the Clerk's salary and insurance premiums. The balance goes on Council subscriptions, newsletter, office costs, village plants, maintenance, provision for room hire and miscellaneous items.

Public Consultation on Greater Lincolnshire devolution deal: Lincolnshire County Council, North Lincolnshire Council and North East Lincolnshire Council have worked with Government officials to produce a devolution proposal. This means existing money and power can move from central government to decision-makers in Greater Lincolnshire. A survey has been produced in order to seek views from all stakeholders and this is available to complete on-line at: https://www.letstalk.lincolnshire.gov.uk/devolution - There are also a number of public drop in sessions being held across Lincolnshire. 
