NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council held an **Extraordinary Meeting on 22nd October** to discuss the Cover Letter and Amendments to the proposed cycle track on land off Donington Road, South Willingham. The overwhelming concern was access from Station Road. An alternative access from the B1225 (ref 52385 on Ordinance Survey 282) was communicated to ELDC.

At the Parish Council Meeting on **23rd November**, representatives from Northern Power and Helen Gamble from the Lincolnshire Wolds Countryside Service attended and gave details of the forthcoming project to upgrade power supplies to the village and surrounding farms. Houses directly affected will be contacted by Northern Power and consulted regarding access over driveways. All residents should be aware that the project will involve a temporary 30mph speed restriction and traffic lights to protect the work force. Work is expected to commence March/April 2023.

The next parish council meeting is on 8th February 2023 at 7pm. Location to be decided.


