## Donington-on-Bain Village Hall ...

Donington-on-Bain is extremely lucky to have a large and well-appointed Village Hall. It is a great community asset maintained by a small group of volunteers. Community events are held at the Hall and it is also available for hire by individuals and groups.

Despite having been closed for most of the last two years a lot of work has gone on. This has included the fitting of new windows and guttering, the digging of a 'French drain' to relieve a problem with damp and repairs to the gate have been made. The inside of the Hall has also enjoyed some attention: the toilets have been redecorated, a new industrial-sized cooker has been installed and a collection of historic images of the village has been displayed.

Whilst maintaining the fabric of the building is important, it is pointless if the building is not used and enjoyed by the local community. The Village Hall Committee has a number of public events in the diary

Many of you will have attended the splendid Jubilee Tea organised by the Village Hall Committee. Many thanks go to the band of volunteers who made or provided a selection of delicious sandwiches and cakes. Your generous donations raised £183 for the Hall. There is a regular coffee morning held on the first Thursday of the month and from September there will also be a 'craft and chat' session held on the third Thursday of the month.

Our second annual Tea, Cake and Crafts event will be held on the 19th November. Last year's event was very well attended. The standard of the crafts on sale was very high and many people left the event with a truly unique present for a loved one.

We will finally be holding our twice postponed Race Night on 22nd October.

The previous event held was a great success with many members of our community enjoying a 'flutter on the gee-gees' and raising valuable funds for the maintenance of the Village Hall.

Other plans for the coming twelve months include the possibility of a wine tasting event, another tabletop sale, a scarecrow festival and at least one village tea party. **Keep an eye on our Facebook page** and the notice board for more details of these events.

In addition to these public activities, the Hall can be hired by groups and individuals for a variety of activities: there is a regular yoga class and a mother and toddlers group. The hall is also used by the Parish Council for their monthly meeting and by a local band as a practice space. The Hall also makes an excellent and inexpensive venue for a range of social activities. It is a great place for children's parties, christening and marriage celebrations.

The Parish Council is discussing producing a walks leaflet to be distributed in strategic areas around the village. For this project there could be funding from the ELDC. There is also a commitment to a donation from a local business.

LCC highways have erected the signs at Welsdale Road advising that the road is not suitable for HGV vehicles. The road has also been resurfaced.

The parish council have again been busy with maintenance and repairs in the cemetery, MUGA and Children's playground.

The two main areas that are in need of repair are the children's playground and tennis courts. We have received quotes for the cleaning and re-surfacing of the tennis courts. We have also applied to Active Lincolnshire/Sport England for funding for both areas. The Parish council have decided to plant spring bulbs in the Autumn on Parish Land to add some colour to the village.

Notes of the Asterby and Goulceby Annual Meeting of the Parish Council held on 23rd May 2022

The Chair gave an update on activity across the year at the Annual Parish Meeting that was held prior to the Council meeting. No members of the public were in attendance. The notes are available on the Parish Council website.

Jon Mold was appointed as Chair of the Council for the forthcoming year.

Quotes for a Parish Council Notice Board for Asterby were considered and a decision reached. This will now be ordered and installed on the green triangle at Asterby End.

The team at **Lincolnshire Chalk Stream Project** have advised that they are very busy with other funded projects in the near future and have suggested we contact them at a future date to plan a chalk stream activity for the villages, this will be deferred until 2023.

Suggestions for how the village might commemorate the Platinum Jubilee were considered and it was resolved to contact LCC Highways with a view to installing a self watering mounted planter on the railing over the bridge at Main Street. In the meantime costs and options will be explored and brought back to a future meeting.

There was concern that the issue with the road subsidence on Horncastle Road had not been progressed by highways, despite members of the parish council contacting LCC several times, and that the repaired hole had reappeared. It was agreed that the parish clerk write to highways expressing our disappointment and asking LCC to provide a date by which the issue will be resolved, or a rationale as to why it is still outstanding.

Correspondence from ELDC on planning applications was considered and noted.

### **Dog Fouling**

Following several complaints to the Parish Council about the increasing problem of dog fouling, new warning signs and dog waste bag dispensers have been distributed around the village in an attempt to resolve the problem.

### Life Events in our villages

**Baptisms** are sometimes called Christenings; this is a service of welcome. It is a way for new Christians to formally mark the beginning of the Christian journey. A person can be baptised as an adult or as a child, and you are baptised into membership of the Church, not into a particular branch or denomination. During the service, we use holy oil to bless, holy water to cleanse, and give a lighted candle as a sign of the light of Christ. Parents and Godparents make promises which affirm their belief in God and their intention to nurture those being baptised in the Christian faith. Some families prefer to have a thanksgiving service for their child. This is less formal but it is still an opportunity to welcome a new baby or a young child into the family. These services are great fun and we do not make a charge for them but ask if you might consider a donation to the church. For further information please contact Revd Cilla or our Administrator

**Planning a wedding** is an exciting time, and there is a great deal to think about. Whatever stage you are at, we want to help and support you. When a couple get married, they make lifelong vows to each other in the presence of God. In the wedding service we celebrate their love for each other and give thanks to God who is the source of all our loves. The rings that are the symbol of their commitment are blessed, the couple are blessed, and the ceremony ends with the blessing of everyone gathered to support them. It is possible to get married in any of our churches if you have a connection with the Parish. It is possible to marry even if you don't qualify by living in one of the parishes and you can talk to us about that possibility. The village churches are beautiful and surrounded by wonderful countryside. We have opportunities in so many ways to make your day incredibly special. If you would like to discuss being married in one of the churches just contact Revd Cilla or our Administrator initially.

**Funerals** can be conducted either in church or at the crematorium. When somebody dies, it is usual for the family to contact a funeral director who will then be in touch with us directly to arrange for someone to conduct the funeral. The person taking the funeral will arrange to meet with you to discuss the service and learn more about the person who has died. At the funeral service, we give thanks to God for the life of the person who has died, we pray for the family and friends who are grieving, we commend the departed person to God's eternal care, and we give thanks for God's gift of eternal life. We can, if you wish, help after a funeral with support. We are always there to help our communities.
