Priestly ponderings ...

I am a great one for hymns new and old. One that often comes into my mind is. 'Count your blessings, name them one by one. Count your blessings see what God has done'

I often think of these words when I see the terrible earthquake damage in Turkey and Syria. Let alone the unexpected deaths, the wars and traumas that we constantly hear and see in the newspapers and the news. I return to the Bible, the time of Noah and the flood. God promised that he would never send that sort of event again and his rainbow was a sign to remind us of His promise.. (Genesis9:8-17). He did, however, charge us with care of our environment. God put people into the Garden of Eden and charged them with the stewardship (Genesis 2:15). So we have a responsibility to look after our planet.

We are told that today even less people believe in God, although many say they are spiritual. I wonder what that means to our society today? Does that explain why we are so careless with our environment? On our way home, from pastures new, we saw endless amounts of rubbish on the side of the road. A fire hazard in the hot weather, no doubt, but something that to me indicates how 'careless' people are about the place in which we live.

Now don't get me wrong, I am no better than anyone else in this. However, if I turn to my bible to explore options for our lives, written hundreds of years ago, when people, perhaps in their more simplistic, uncluttered and less scientific knowledge. I find that they believed that God had something to do with where they lived and what it looked like. You only have read psalms and hymns to hear those words. A popular hymn 'All things bright and beautiful' reminds us of our beautiful, God created world and how blessed we are to be in it. Psalm 8:3-9 which speaks of Divine Majesty and Human Dignity is another.

Lincolnshire is a county of farm land, green pastures and wide skies, this is never more obvious than in March as spring flowers flourish, fields are ploughed and sown, if not already, lambs appear and the world reawakens. This reawakening runs alongside our spiritual journey of Lent. A time to consider balancing the inner and outer side of who we are. Just as the spring equinox balances the dark and light our worlds, bringing longer days and shorter nights.

As you and I look forward to Easter (named after Oeste the goddess of light and spring, often pictured with a basket of eggs, long before Eggs were associated with the festival) we remember the story of Jesus, a good man unfairly tried, tortured and killed. A man who shone light into the darkness of a world that chose to extinguish that light. He rose from the dead on the third day and, even spiritual people, who put nature as their book of life and not the bible, would have to admit that this story of birth, death and rebirth is a metaphor for their spirituality.

Christians believe that God forgives us and by sending a Son, Jesus, who died on the cross and who was given a new life, he opened up a new relationship between us and God. Read the story in any of the Gospels and you will find displayed there the whole of human life as much then as it is now. April and Easter are an opportunity to celebrate how power can be turned around; how courage can be found in the face of adversity; about how we can find hope in that newly born world around us.

Most important of all, how we can live in peace with God, with each other and with the earth and ourselves.

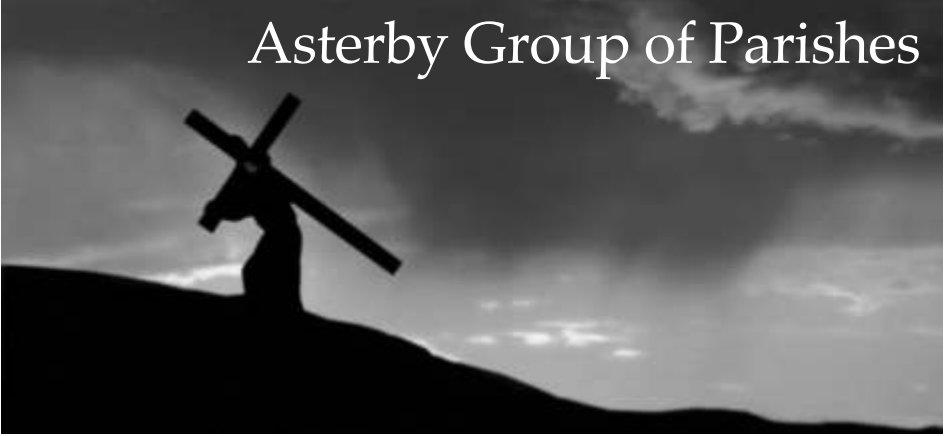

Proposals to address refurbishment required to MUGA

Refurbishment and repairs are needed to the Multi Use Games Area (MUGA). The Parish council has unsuccessfully pursued grant funding in the past but will continue to apply for new funding grants. In addition the Parish Council is carrying out maintenance to maintain and repair the Playground. In 2020 the Parish councils application for lottery funding for the playground was rejected as the fund was concentrating on COVID related applications.

It is proposed to utilize some of the Parish council's carry forward (contingency) funds to address the refurbishment of the MUGA. This is a valuable village asset and it is the parish council's responsibility to maintain all assets. This may be undertaken over several financial years.

There is an ongoing issue with dog owners not cleaning up after their pets in a few villages lately. Both Scamblesby and Benniworth residents have reported an increase in fouling.

We have had reports of people having to clean poop from their own property, off pavements, footpaths and on drives

This is not acceptable

It is the law to clean up after your pet EVERYWHERE that is both public and private , roads, verges, footpaths, pavements, green areas, parks.

It can be reported to Council and is a finable offence of up to £1000

It is also a health risk to anyone who comes into contact with faeces and children are especially vulnerable

Most Councils have a zero tolerance to dog fouling and enforce the **Dog (fouling of Land) Act 1996** and under the **Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014**, owners who regularly allow their dogs to foul in public places would be committing anti-social behaviour.

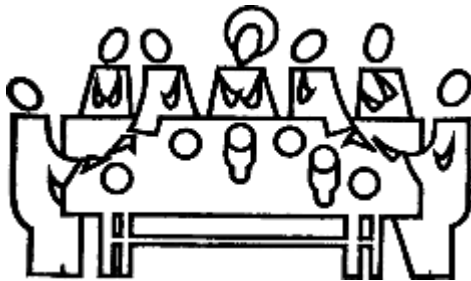

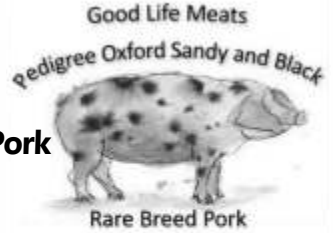
