Priestly ponderings

I am writing this on Good Friday, I know the editorial date is today! - but it's been such a busy time and I am glad to be able to tell you that today was warm and beautiful and we had a tremendous crowd of followers behind the crosses at Red Hill. It was truly an uplifting service but at the same time very poignant as we turned to see the three crosses on the top of the hill. Why am I telling you this, you may ask? Well it's been two years since we were able to get together in this way and to sing and pray in the most natural amphitheatre in the Wolds. So it was incredibly special to be there today.

May and June are interesting months in the life of the church. We continue with Easter right up until the beginning of June. The bible stories are all about the disciples learning to live without Jesus in their lives. These are stark reminders for all of us who have been bereaved about how hard it is to cope; about how we wish they were back with us; about how we have seen them crossing the road or walking along with us. All of these things, humans have experienced since the beginning of time. It just serves us to remember how hard it has been for everyone during the pandemic and even if we have not lost loved ones through that illness, how hard it is for us when they leave us accidentally or through something that cannot be cured medically. Yet we are resilient people, who have done much in our lives and we learn, day by day, hour by hour how to go about our daily living without them in our lives. The disciples too learnt this and I recommend reading the Acts of the Apostles, it is a great tale of daring deeds, of finding a way and learning how to become spreaders of the word. It begins with the reminder that Jesus told his disciples they would receive a helper, the Holy Spirit, and then he ascended into heaven which we celebrate always on the last Thursday in the Easter Season. The disciples though, could not do what Jesus had asked them to do until they had received the Holy Spirit and this day is called Pentecost and falls this year on the same weekend as the Jubilee celebrations.

Knowing that the Queen is a woman of great faith, I just wondered if she had chosen this weekend on purpose. You see we consider it to be the birthday of the church. After the disciples received the Holy Spirit which came as wind and tongues of fire, they went out into the streets and it enabled what they said to be understood by everyone, even people who didn't speak their language. It was amazing and thousands of people were baptised by the disciples, as Jesus had instructed them to do when he held the last supper. I spoke about loss and how the fear of loss is powerful. Fear drives so much of what we do, particularly fear of loss - loss of control and freedom, loss of respect, loss of love and life. But the ultimate loss - death and eternal judgment - is the heart of fear that Christianity drives away. The Apostle John wrote, "God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God lives in them ..." I use this at wedding ceremonies. There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love." Says 1 John 4:14–18) Jesus died on the cross so that we may no longer fear the ending of our lives and that we might be without sin. We have a sure and certain hope that our mortality has been defeated and that in Jesus we will share in a real future victory, which has been won for us, over the decay and frailty of our present lives and this world. It is a lot to take in and believe but many Christians feel their lives are richer for just this reason. Why not take a chance and come along to our services in May and June and see if you can find the love of God in what we do. My blessings for May and June - Revd Cilla

Life Events in our villages

Baptisms are sometimes called Christenings; this is a service of welcome. It is a way for new Christians to formally mark the beginning of the Christian journey. A person can be baptised as an adult or as a child, and you are baptised into membership of the Church, not into a particular branch or denomination. During the service, we use holy oil to bless, holy water to cleanse, and give a lighted candle as a sign of the light of Christ. Parents and Godparents make promises which affirm their belief in God and their intention to nurture those being baptised in the Christian faith. Some families prefer to have a thanksgiving service for their child. This is less formal but it is still an opportunity to welcome a new baby or a young child into the family. These services are great fun and we do not make a charge for them but ask if you might consider a donation to the church. For further information please contact Revd Cilla or our Administrator

Planning a wedding is an exciting time, and there is a great deal to think about. Whatever stage you are at, we want to help and support you. When a couple get married, they make lifelong vows to each other in the presence of God. In the wedding service we celebrate their love for each other and give thanks to God who is the source of all our loves. The rings that are the symbol of their commitment are blessed, the couple are blessed, and the ceremony ends with the blessing of everyone gathered to support them. It is possible to get married in any of our churches if you have a connection with the Parish. It is possible to marry even if you don't qualify by living in one of the parishes and you can talk to us about that possibility. The village churches are beautiful and surrounded by wonderful countryside. We have opportunities in so many ways to make your day incredibly special. If you would like to discuss being married in one of the churches just contact Revd Cilla or our Administrator initially.

Funerals can be conducted either in church or at the crematorium. When somebody dies, it is usual for the family to contact a funeral director who will then be in touch with us directly to arrange for someone to conduct the funeral. The person taking the funeral will arrange to meet with you to discuss the service and learn more about the person who has died. At the funeral service, we give thanks to God for the life of the person who has died, we pray for the family and friends who are grieving, we commend the departed person to God's eternal care, and we give thanks for God's gift of eternal life. We can, if you wish, help after a funeral with support. We are always there to help our communities.

Due to lottery funding COVID projects our lottery bid to replace the playground was rejected. The Parish council continues to maintain and repair the playground to its best abilities. The repairs to the fence around the playground have recently been completed. However due to the age of the playground we expect further deterioration to the equipment and further maintenance costs in 2022/23. We have submitted a grant request to our East Lindsey Councillor for approximately £300 towards these costs.

The Parish Council are considering the proposal to supply a walks leaflet detailing the walks around the village. There was a possibility of funding for the walks leaflet holders via a councillor.

Meeting held on the 7th March 2022

It was noted that the PC does not have the insurance or funds to organise a Platinum Jubilee Event, but an agenda item will be included in the next meeting to agree an appropriate way in which to commemorate the jubilee. Work is ongoing to obtain three like for like quotes for a Noticeboard at Asterby End. In the meantime permission has been granted by LCC to erect the noticeboard on the grass triangle at Asterby End.

The PC has lodged an objection to the Planning Permission submitted for the erection of a store to provide animal shelter, feed and equipment store on land to the east of Horncastle Road, Goulceby
