I was privileged to be sharing collective worship with Donington School recently. I spoke to the school about Special Days and we explored the up-and-coming events of November and December.

It is a very busy time in the church calendar and in our own calendars. We begin November with All Saints and All Souls and move on to Bonfire night and then Remembrance Sunday 13th November. Before we know it, we have reached the last Sunday in November which is the start of Advent when we shall hold a Christingle service in Donington. We are then into planning for Christmas which this year falls on a Sunday. Before that, however, there are lots of Carol Services to be enjoyed. Come and find us. See Christmas at a glance.

These are SPECIAL events but you know really every day is a Special Day because we are so very blessed in our surroundings and our lives. The beauty can be seen in our wonderful skies at sunset and sunrise and the beautiful colours, as our trees and shrubs change their leaves ready for winter. I believe we can thank God for that, as we have done in our harvest Festivals.

On the third Thursday, in Donington, we have a craft session when folks bring anything they are interested in creating to the group. It's an opportunity of sharing your talent!

I hope that everyone in the villages will encourage their friends to come along. It is a regular event and we could increase it if we think it would help. As the days drift through autumn into winter I wish everyone well. May we still find ways to enjoy the Christmas Season and celebrate, with continued awe and wonder, the coming of the baby in Bethlehem who brought such hope to the world.

Newsletter - October 2022

The two main areas that are in need of repair are the children's playground and tennis courts.

The slats at the wooden bridge on the children's playground have been replaced by Cllr Wright and Cllr Gill Stafford. Thanks to Cllr Wright and Gill-Stafford and also to Andrew Butt who carries out weekly inspections of the play area and MUGA during summer and bi-weekly inspections at other times.

The MUGA/Tennis court is also deteriorating. The Parish council is seeking funding for repairs needed to the tennis courts/MUGA but this does not appear to be forthcoming. In the meantime the Parish council will organise for the cleaning of the moss from the courts.

The annual safety inspection has been completed on the Playground and MUGA. The parish council will address the issues raised in the report.

The Parish Council is discussing producing a walks leaflet to be distributed in strategic areas around the village. For this project there could be funding from the ELDC. There is also a commitment to a donation from a local business.

In the near future the Parish council will be planting spring bulbs on Parish Land to add some colour to the village.

Donington on Bain Grass Cutting Contract. Opportunity to Tender

Donington on Bain Parish Council is inviting tenders for grass cutting and strimming of the amenity areas in the village for the **2023**, **2024 & 2025** seasons, a **3 year contract**.

This includes the areas below using machinery which will mulch and leave all grass and vegetation to disperse naturally. The programme of work to be undertaken monthly in April, May, June, July, August and September with invoices submitted for payment at the end of each month.

The work in the respective areas is as follows:

Recreation Area: Cut grass 4 times and strim around play equipment and furniture, each month. Trim overgrowing vegetation from both sides of the fence along by the dyke (where accessible) monthly, and ensuring the entrance gate is clear. All clippings must be swept off rubber tiles immediately following each cut.

Allotment Field: Cut grass from entrance including grass bank and along by the Multi Use Games Area twice each month and strim around edge once each month.

Cemetery: Cut grass twice each month together with area of roadside verge at the access. Strim round graves twice each month and ensure the path and the entrance gate is free of clippings.

Churchyard: The full site to be cut once only as the back area is to be left to grown naturally. The grass from a line midway and at the front of the church to be cut twice each month in May, June, July, August and September with strimming road graves and edges monthly. All clippings to be swept from paths and walkways to leave them clear of vegetation.

Additional: Please quote for a reduced cut which may be required in October with the Recreation Area cut twice and strimming once and the Playing Field, Cemetery and front part of the Churchyard all cut once and strimmed once at the end of the month.

A member of the public was invited to discuss the matter of funds from the Village Gala committee that could be made available for local projects. The Gala Committee had made the decision that the gala was no longer viable as there were now too few committee members. It was decided that the Gala Committee would retain control of the funds and any decisions made as to what projects they are allocated to. NEWS FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes from the September Parish Council meeting can be found on the village noticeboards & on the website.

The new Parish Clerk is Gillian Shaw, email:benniworthpc@outlook.com

The main topics discussed were:

- Village speeding and speeding on the B1225: P Dyas is still waiting for responses from the police as to how these issues can be addressed; unfortunately they are not viewed as high priority with them as we have no history of serious accidents.
- Application for a Tennyson Blue Plaque for the Church: C Raynor is progressing this project, liaising with Rev C Smith.
- Upgrade to services in the village by Northern Power and BT: a member of the village has advised of these upgrades and has expressed concern that there will be disruption in the village twice as the two separate companies will not be aware of the other company's project; he has agreed to try and co-ordinate the 2 companies in the hope that their work might be done at the same time to minimise disruption.
- Neighbourhood Watch: S McAllister is working with other villages to see how we can co-ordinate information and issues.

- The next meeting will be held on 23rd November.

There are many people in the village who help in many ways without having official titles, they see a job and get on with it – **Chris & Charlie Raynor and Jonny Moon** spend hours mowing and tidying the church grounds; they also recently planted a new Crab Apple Tree which they are nurturing to ensure that it establishes itself.

Christingles are usually held from the end of November through to February - Advent to Candlemas.

What is the Christingle made from?

During the service, each person makes a Christingle and the candles are all lit to create a warm, magical glow symbolising the light of Christ and bringing hope to people living in darkness. Christingles are made using oranges, sweets and dried fruits. You light the candle at the end of a service to spread a magical glow around everyone.



Each element of a Christingle has a special meaning and helps to tell the Christian story

The orange represents the world

The red ribbon symbolises the love and blood of Christ

The sweets and dried fruit represent all of God's creations

The lit candle represents Jesus's light in the world, bringing hope to people living
