

Priestly ponderings ...

We've arrived in September but what a summer we have not had. Did I miss it or was it really as wet as I thought? I am sorry for our farmers who must have been standing on their heads to work out when to harvest. So our harvest festivals may be more imporant this year than ever before, if they are not too exhausted to attend.

I have watched this celebration of our countryside and the generosity of God sadly become less attended over the past few years. I am sure our farms must celebrate the end to all the hard work that is required to 'safely gather in' their crops. Even if that extends only to a sigh of relief. Our young people have changed the meaning of Harvest too and maybe that has something to do with meals produced in factories rather than in our kitchens. Don't get me wrong, whilst I enjoy the chance to cook from scratch, I am not averse to the odd bought pie or pizza! Our local school at their harvest festival told us about the miles that some of our food travels to get to our door. So it's worth remembering those issues too.

So where does all this leave us in our faith? Well, for me, I guess it reminds me of the simple life. Or the simpler life where roast meat and vegetables was the order of the day. The veg more likely to be in season, when Summer was salad and Winter was warm, cosy foods. A less lavish and more simple way of eating meals.

It always strikes me, when I read both Old and New Testament, that life was simpler then too. Mind you there is nothing new is there? Near starvation, the Jews thanked God for the Manna that was their salvation. I would like to believe that UNICEF/SAVE THE CHILDREN, etc provide manna in a different way but just as important. Harvest in some countries doesn't exist because they are constantly on the 'bread line' and crops fail endlessly because of drought and war.

Jesus used the harvest, sowing and reaping, often in his ministry. He was not talking just about what people would have understood practically but he used these stories to illustrate that 'sowing' – sharing faith, testifying, talking about your story or 'reaping'-leading people to Christ are all important and when we 'harvest the outcomes' everyone benefits.

What do I mean by all this? Only that the acts of kindness and generosity are of benefit to all humankind and demonstrate our love of people and their needs,

especially when we have so much. So it is imperative that we do this, because loving our friends and neighbours is the right sort of harvest, whether we are Christians or not.

Heavenly Father, help us to remove our prejudices of race and upbringing; of what part of town a person lives in, or how much money others have; for being narrow and selfish in our outlook. Give us a world vision of the world-wide harvest that you are seeking in our day. Give us eyes to see how great this harvest can be and to volunteer to be your hands and feet on earth today. So that our food becomes working to do your will. That we may find fulfilment in knowing that we do all this in your name. Amen.

Speeding

Speeding is an issue that the Parish Council takes very seriously. At the meeting on 26 June, the Parish Council resolved to purchase a speed detection gun. We are liaising with a parishioner who has offered to complete some training on using the gun. He has also identified a number of volunteers to help with its use. Once the speed gun system is operating, we will have the data regarding the extent of the speeding issue. The Parish Council has requested, via Lincolnshire County Councillor Marfleet, a review of the speed limits in the village and a 20mph speed limit by the primary school. The Parish Council has also requested the erection of 40mph repeater signs along Station Road.

Parking

As a result of pressure from the Parish Council over a number of years, there is a consultation underway regarding proposed waiting restrictions at the junctions of Main Road and Glebe Close, and Main Road and Chapel Lane. The Parish Council continues to put pressure on Lincolnshire County Council via Cllr Marfleet but progress is slow. Proposals to erect new village signs

The Parish Council is proposing to erect two new village signs. These will be silhouette style in powdered steel. The design concepts have been selected from the competition entries from the children at Donington on Bain Primary School.

MUGA/playground

The moss has been removed from the MUGA, and the surface has been cleaned. The Parish Council is aware of damage to wood boards around the MUGA. Following a consultation with parishioners, an application for grant funding to refurbish the MUGA has been submitted. Whilst the Parish Council is sorry to see the preschool leave the village after so many years, we are delighted to take over its gym trail. Weather permitting, the equipment will be installed in the children's play area in early August.

There have been no Parish Council meetings since the last newsletter was published so there is no new Council business to report.

However, in other news: Horncastle Road, Goulceby - Closure. The Horncastle Road closure has been extended to 30th November (2023) to allow for remedial works to be carried out.

Fast fibre broadband - Residents of Goulceby will have seen swarms of technicians from a company called Quickline in the village recently. Quickline have just completed a full fast fibre installation across the village which will provide fast broadband connection speeds at around 100mbps. Being in receipt of Government grants, the company is rolling out fast broadband to more rural areas which traditionally only have very low broadband speeds. This new fast broadband should be available from around the beginning of November once commissioning and testing has been completed. Quickline are offering the first three months connection free for new customers. In addition to this, if customers have a contract with an existing provider which does not expire for some time, the company will provide the fast broadband "Free until you're free". This basically means that they will provide the connection free until customers' existing contracts expire.
